



It has always been co-educational. In 1890, the second Morrill Act was possed on the the second Morrill Act was passed. This enabled the school to become the Black Land Grant College for the State of Florida. in 1891, the college was moved from its original location west of Of town to its present location which was once the site "Highwood," Territorial Governor W.P. Duval's slave plantation The site is one of the highest hills in Tallahassee. The school was known as Florida A&M College from 1909 until 1953, Who it attained university status. On May 6, 1996, the historic Florida A&M University campus
