Testing and Preparation - Definitions



Diagnostics

Exam or other assessment used to determine the extent to which students have mastered specific content; imbedded in courses and aligns to curriculum mastery

Clinical Preparation

Targeted activities and/or courses designed to prepare students for clinical training

Licensure Exam Preparation

Exams and study materials that specifically prepare students to sit for licensure exams; covers all required content (as opposed to diagnostics)

Comprehensive Preparation

End-of-program exam used to assess student mastery of content that will be included on the licensure exam

DPT Testing (5/5)



Practice Exam & Assessment Tool (PEAT) Given digitally, as a timed, computer-based, multiple-choice practice exam for NPTE candidates. Uses questions from retired NPTE and other questions similar to those on the actual exam • Administered in Clinical Education IV at end of final semester • Serves as the program's final comprehensive exam • 2 exams; 250 questions each; 5 hours • ≥80% = passing score • Failing score requires remediation and re-testing in 5 days • Failure in re-testing will delay graduation from program, require remediation and re-testing after 8 weeks		PY3

PharmD Testing (2/6)



	P3
Diagnostic	Pharmacy Curriculum Outcomes Assessment (PCOA) Standardized test that is used to assess students' mastery of content and to evaluate the program's curriculum • Administered in Pre-APPE readiness course • Cumulative assessment of the didactic curriculum • 225 questions covering four areas • Accounts for 25% of final course grade • Passage allows for progression to the P4 year • Learners receive their personal score reports in early summer • Scores generally correlate with licensure exam results

PharmD Testing (3/6)



P3 Pre APPE-Readiness Course The purpose of this course is to ensure that the learner has achieved competency in educational concepts integrated throughout the curriculum and assess their readiness to enter Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPE). This course provides active learning activities, assessments, and objective structured clinical examinations (OSCEs) that evaluate clinical competence and stimulates learner responsibilities during an APPE. Various assessments administered throughout the course Clinical Pass/fail course Passing score required on each assessment to pass course **Preparation** • Students engage in remediation activities until the assessment(s), or approved equivalent, is satisfactorily completed • Progression to advanced experiential courses is contingent on demonstration of competency in all areas of assessment

	RxPrep The College provides the RxPrep NAPLEX Course book and Online Access for entering P4 learners; contains all of the essential content for the licensure exam.
Licensure Exam Preparation	 The Online Course contains 80+ Video Lectures that correspond with each chapter in the NAPLEX Course Book 3700+ practice questions in the RxPrep Test Bank Study guides are provided for P4 learners enrolled in <i>Clinical Seminar</i> and <i>Research Methods I, II,</i> and <i>III</i>
	 Requirement for students enrolled in <i>Clinical Seminar</i> and <i>Research Methods</i> to take biweekly examinations per the study guide College provides an RxPrep 3-day Live NAPLEX Review in March/April Following the review, the learners engage in self-directed study for the remainder of the month

PharmD Testing (5/6)

Comprehensive	Comprehensive Exam Administered through RxPrep and is a compilation of all didactic coursework and experiential training concepts. • Administered at end of final semester (not part of a course) • 100 questions; 2.5 hours • ≥75% = passing score (required for graduation) • Learners have 3 attempts before graduation; 2 additional attempts will be allowed in
	 subsequent semesters Scored by RxPrep database; learners receive scores immediately upon completion of the exam

PharmD Testing (6/6)



	Post-Graduation
Licensure Exam Preparation	NAPLEX practice exam developed by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). Contains questions from previous licensure exams to assist with acclimation to the format of the NAPLEX. • Taken after graduation when graduates are ready to sit for the NAPLEX • 100 questions; 2.2 hours • Scored by NABP database; learners receive scores immediately upon completion of the exam

TEAS Version 7 (2021) will begin June 2022 • Multiple-Choice Item Types: includes charts, exhibits, and graphics • Alternate Item Types: Select all that apply; Fill in the blank, Hot Spot, Ordered Response items
Diagnostic	 No Partial credit will be given Sections: Proficiency is required in each section Reading (39 Questions) English & Language Usage (33 Questions) Math (34 Questions) - Algebra, Measure & Data Science (44 Questions) - A&P, Biology, Chemistry, Scientific Reasoning
	Piloting Summer 2022 - TEAS Test to be given in First Year Experience course Part of Admission Criteria: Students typically test in Sophomore year • Students are able to take the test only 3 times in one calendar year

Level 1 Proficiency: Meeting the Proficiency Level 1 standard can be considered to meet the absolute minimum expectations for performance in this content area. Scores at this level were judged by the content expert panel to indicate a student as likely to just meet NCLEX-RN® standards in this content area.

Level 2 Proficiency: Meeting the Proficiency Level 2 standard can be considered to exceed minimum expectations for performance in this content area. Scores at this level were judged by the content expert panel to indicate a student as fairly certain to meet NCLEX-RN standards in this content area.

Nursing Testing (6/8)



	Level 5
Comprehensive Exam (Simulates NCLEX)	Comprehensive Predictor Administered through Assessment Testing Institute (ATI). The examination tests the students' competencies based on content learned across the entire BSN curriculum. • Prior to the Comprehensive Predictor the SON provides a 4-day Live Review from ATI • 180 questions; 3 hours • Proficiency Level = passing score (required for graduation) • Students have 2 attempts before graduation (the two scores are averaged to determine proficiency) • If passing score is not attained: Senior Seminar must be repeated and 2 additional attempts will be allowed in subsequent semesters

	<u>Virtual ATI (VATI) Predictor</u>
Licensure Exam Preparation	 Each student receives a Virtual ATI Coach, who is an experienced nurse educator Students must work through specialized content and take assessments to identify their areas of deficits. Then the students remediate and demonstrate proficiency before moving to the next level. Students must review and pass all levels before being approved to take the VATI Predictor Passing the VATI gives the students "Green Light" status Access to 'Board Vitals' which is a test bank w/ over 3000 questions w/ 30% in alternate formats using adaptive quizzes. Graduates have access for 12 weeks The SON provides a 4-day Live Review from ICAN Following the review, the learners engage in self-directed study until they sit for the licensure exam; they are provided a detailed 5-week post-graduation study plan
