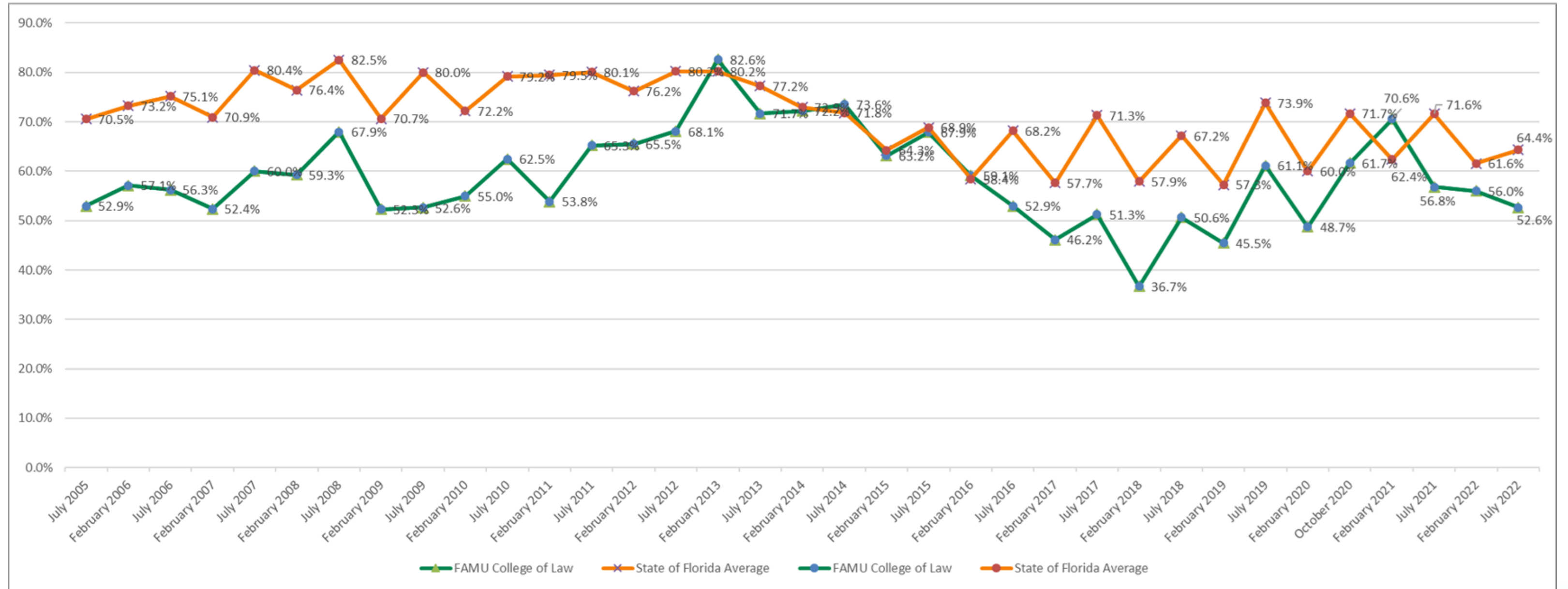

The bar outcomes for the college are in line with prior administrations and predictive analytics.



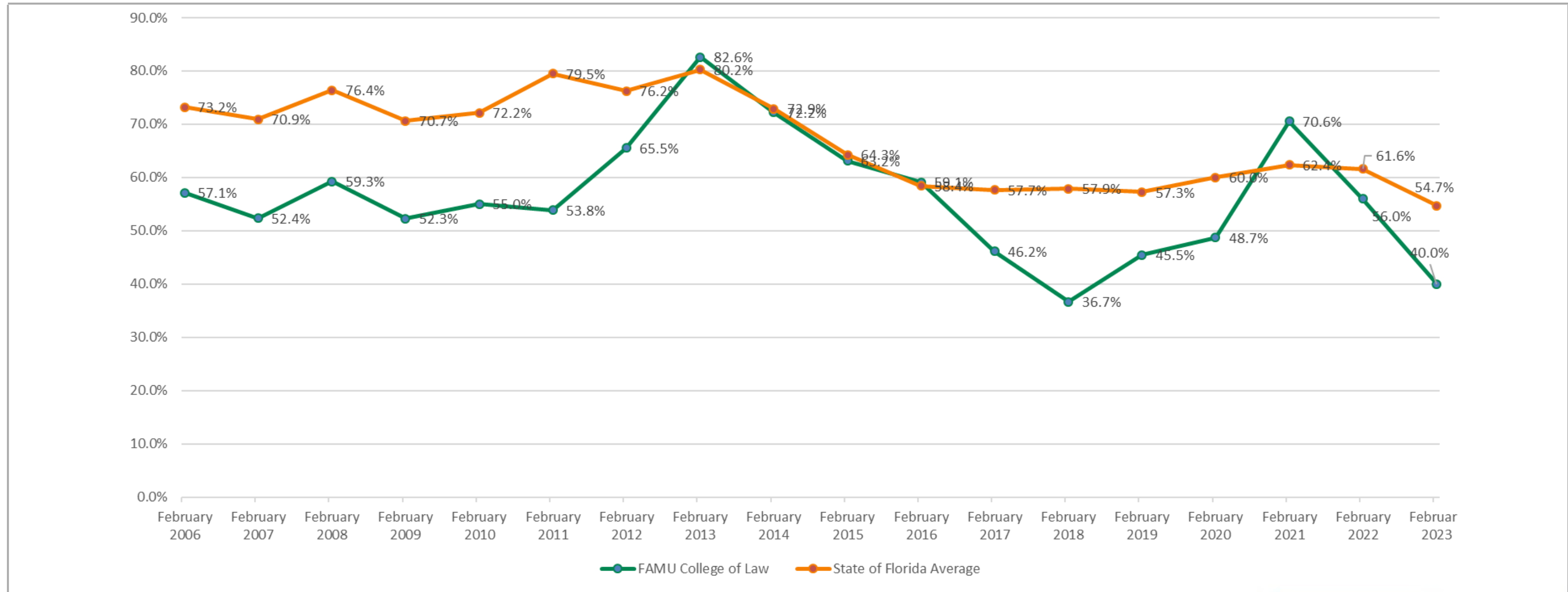

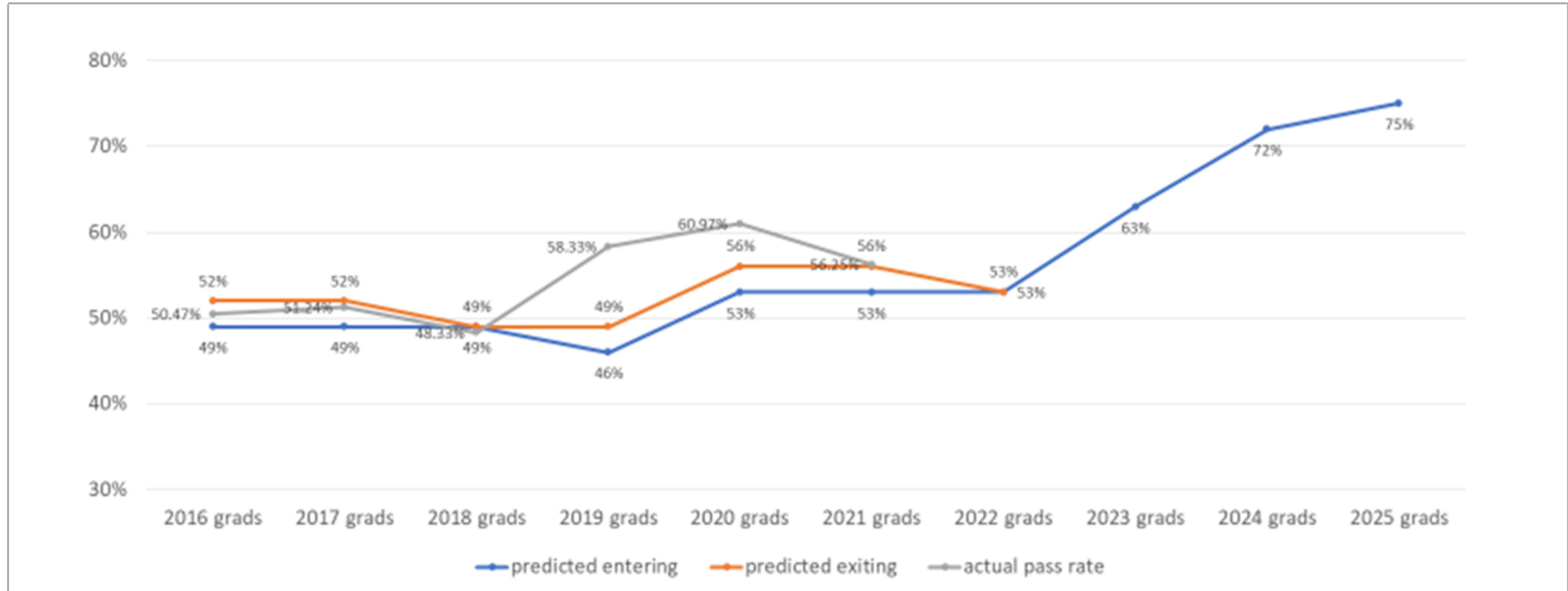
